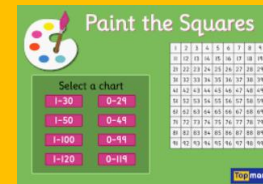


Making groups up to 10

Warm up

- Play number splat <https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/paint-the-squares>
- Clap and count numbers both forwards and backwards.



Activities

Explain that today we are learning about making equal groups up to 10. This is called 'sharing'.

Practise counting up to 10 and back using small objects e.g. biscuits, pencils, cubes.

Next, use 2 large plates or pieces of paper. Can you share out 10 into two groups? Use the phrase "one for you, one for you".

Can you check it is fair? How do you know? Use the words 'equal' and 'even' to explain that both groups are the same and so it is fair! If one group has more or less, it is not fair!

Next, introduce a third plate/piece of paper. How can we share into 3 groups? How about 4 groups?

*Try sharing different numbers up to 10 e.g. sharing 6 objects.
