## SEPTEMBER REOPENING

I have included below the organisation for the start of the new school year in September from my letter last week. I would like to thank you for your patience and understanding of these timings.

If you have children in key stage 2 and you need to bring them to school before dropping off children in key stage 1 or different timings for key stage 2 drop offs you can leave your child at the early time. There will be 'holding bays' for each class to wait until their start time. There will be staff on duty to supervise these children across the classes to ensure safety and distancing between the classes.

To allow the children to become accustomed to the new systems, we have decided to have a phased entry to school at the start of September. Therefore the children will be invited into school on the following days before everyone starts fully on Monday 7 September. (Please note the correct date and day)

Tuesday 1 September	INSET DAY school closed to all children

Please remember that normal school uniform should be worn from the beginning of term. The only exceptions for this will be on a day when the children have PE. We would ask you that you send the children into school in their PE kits as it minimizes the changing elements and taking PE bags to and from home.

# **CURRICULUM**

There will be more details posted on the website this week relating to what the curriculum will look like in September. We will start as we usually do with our Wellbeing introduction to the new school year and will then focus our attention on assessing where the children are in their learning after so long out of school. I know that the children have been learning and following our online activities, however we recognize the fact that many parents have been working throughout this period and the children's experiences will be varied. We will then establish next steps and let parents know how these will be assessed to enable all pupils to be ready for the curriculum for their new year group.

# **LUNCHES**

During the first few days in September there will be the option of school sandwiches on the day your child comes into school (ham, cheese or tuna - if tuna is not shown as an option please choose the chicken or egg as this will be replaced by tuna). From the 7 September there will be a reduced menu of hot food such as hot dogs, fish fingers and chips and pizza alongside school sandwiches. These will be delivered to the children's classrooms to be eaten there. A menu will be shared fully via email at the start of September. Lunches from 2 September should be ordered via ParentPay as before lockdown.
