SOCIAL DISTANCING

Thank you so much to those parents who are setting good examples for children and others to follow regarding social distancing. In light of the greater restrictions placed on the country as from last Thursday, it is increasingly important that we stick to all the social distancing rules and guidance wherever we are. Unfortunately, we received a complaint from a member of the community last week regarding this very issue when parents are leaving the school after collection. Whilst we are unable to do anything about this when you are not on school grounds, we can insist that the rules are applied. Thank you for your co-operation. Things are



improving in the car park and playground, however we all have to be extremely mindful of the health and wellbeing of everyone.

I have to say that the children, when in school, have been adhering to the new routines, procedures and rules extremely well. They know the hand washing regulations, cleaning, staying within their class bubbles at play times and lunchtimes plus how to attempt to remain socially distanced. Their return to school has been very successful.

PARENTAL CONSULTATION - ZOOM WITH MR SMITH

I would like to say thank you to all those parents who were able to join me on Zoom on Friday afternoon to discuss the communication, re-opening of school and next steps. I found it a really positive meeting with lots of useful comments. It was good to hear from parents, their experiences of the school closure but also how the letters and website have been received over the past few months. We discussed the level of communication from school regarding all of the changes to routines and information sent out over lockdown and returning to school. All parents were positive about this and welcomed the information despite there being so much of it.

We also discussed the work set during lockdown and contact between children and teachers. Most were happy with this but some would have liked to have seen feedback from teachers on work. During this time the letters did encourage parents to send in work and lots did. However, when it came to Term 6 all of the teachers were in the bubbles teaching so this may not have been possible.

The return to school has gone very smoothly for all and parents have appreciated this as well as their children enjoying being back with their friends. Positive comments are always appreciated by the staff so

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thank you for those. One element highlighted was the amount of hand washing that is taking place. Some children are finding that their hands are becoming dry or cracked and sore. If this is the case for your child then please do send them to school with a small tube of hand lotion that they will need to administer themselves. This can be kept in school if possible.


The next theme was regarding those children who are having to self-isolate or subsequent bubble or lockdown closures and work being set. The letter attached to this email will explain this further so please do make sure you read it.

One of the most discussed items was the **lack of social distancing from parents in the playground** and outside on the pavement. I appreciate that we have tried our best to provide these messages over the past three weeks. Many parents are abiding by these, however there are some who are still not. **There was a request and general consensus for the school to ask parents to wear masks on the school site.** This is being considered but if you would feel more comfortable wearing a mask then please do so. This may be a rule that we will have to enforce in the very near future. We discussed extending the bubbles to key stages and perhaps for the staggered collection times. We will have to see how this may work. We are also starting a trial of the children in Reception and Years 5 and 6 having lunch in the Hall this week (at different times). If this is successful we may be able to extend this to all children and offer a wider range of meals. I will keep you informed of how it goes.

There will be another session similar to Friday's either towards the end of this term or beginning of next term for us to catch up and for me to see how things are going from a parent's perspective. I look to forward to seeing you all again soon.

A reminder about when and when not to send your children to school

If you or your child or older siblings at different school have sypmtoms of Covid 19 you must self-isolate immediately until you have have a test and the results have been returned. Please ensure you inform the school as soon as you can to inform the office as we have to report all suspected and positive cases to Public Health England on the same day. A letter is being emailed alongside the newsletter with information about work being sent home if your child has to self-isolate. Please note work wil not be sent home for other absences as is normal practice unless due to a hospital stay and recovery for a specific reason. The government have written a letter to all parents setting out when you should and should not have your child tested. CURRICULUM

At Almondsbury we pride ourselves on our curriculum and how well the children learn. As you know we have been implementing our 'Re-engagement' curriculum, which at the heart



of it is the book 'Here We Are' by Oliver Jeffers. This has taken the children's imagination and the work completed has been excellent. We are creating long standing displays from this work across the school. The book 'is a tour through the land, the sea, the sky, our bodies; dioramas of our wild diversity and a sense of unity of everyone on the planet'. The children have completed artwork, poems, letters, creative writing and much more. This has been complemented by the use of the children's 'Happy boxes' and scrapbooks which they







eagerly shared with each other at the start of the term.

The children have also been working through back to school transition units in mathematics based on number, explanation or reasoning of how calculations are solved. This has enabled the teacher to assess where the children's



learning 'gaps' which are to be addressed over the coming weeks and term.

Our focus has also been on the wellbeing and mental health of all children as well as their understanding of the times we are living through. The activities have provided them the time to reflect on their wellbeing and how well they are interacting with others as well as their own thoughts and feelings. These have been very successful with the children reporting that they have helped them return to school easily.









It is now time to restart our normal curriculum offer which has changed for this year. We have a few new topics that the children will be able to learn about. The learning has been re-sequenced to enable the children to have more reinforcement and re-visiting of concepts before embarking on new ones. The Knowledge and Understanding curriculum team (Mrs Goode, Miss Wingett, Miss Hake and Mr Garcia) worked tirelessly during the partial closure of school during the summer term to put the final touches for the rest of the teachers to then plan their weekly learning from the overviews. These can been seen on the Knowledge and Understanding page on the website. They are also included in the class jigsaw curriculum maps on each class webpage.

Please do make sure you have a read of these to know what the children will be learning this term. We are very excited by these new aspects of learning and look forward to the children's work.
