COVID UPDATES

Thank you to everyone for adhering to our request for face coverings on the school site. This is much appreciated as are the efforts being made to set examples of social distancing.

The trial of the Reception and Year 5 and 6 children eating in the Hall at lunchtime has been very successful. Although, it is not like it used to be, it's a little bit of normality back for the children has been positive. We are not able to extend this to have another key phase into the Hall over lunch time due to the amount of time we have to allow for each set of children to eat and then the Hall be cleaned and left inbetween. Therefore, we will be swapping the children eating in the Hall on a rota basis. This week and next it will be Reception and Years 1 and 2.

We have decided as a result of this success that we will extend the bubbles in school to include the key phase. The children go out to play in their key phases already, although in different zones on the field and playground so this is an extension of this. This move will allow us to plan for year groups working to allow the 'catch up' sessions that are being planned to be more effective. The decision has been taken due to the very low number of suspected cases being seen in school (none for the past fortnight) plus the healthiness of the children as we have practically full attendance, which is great to see.

If anything changes I will keep you all updated.


Thank you for being sensible when sending your children to school. Our attendance has increased over the past month with no more than 4 children absent from school on any given day. The first month's attendance has been 97.1% which is down on our usual 98.9% for obvious reasons, but much higher than the national attendance average at 90%.

VIRTUAL HARVEST FESTIVAL

This year we are holding our Harvest Festival via Zoom in each classroom on Tuesday 13 October. A reminder about when and when not to send your children to school

If you or your child or older siblings at different school have sypmtoms of Covid 19 you must self-isolate immediately until you have have a test and the results have been returned. Please ensure you inform the school as soon as you can to inform the office as we have to report all suspected and positive cases to Public Health England on the same day. A letter is being emailed alongside the newsletter with information about work being sent home if your child has to self-isolate. Please note work will not be sent home for other absences as is normal practice unless due to a hospital stay and recovery for a specific reason. I would like to thank the PCSO's for coming down to school over the past week or so to monitor the parking in the village. We are in discussions with Will Price, our named PCSO and the council regarding the parking issues being seen in order to try to resolve these and alleviate pinch points. I know that parking is a contentious issue and always has been, not just at our school but at schools up and down the country. However, please remember to park safely and sensibly. Also remember to be courteous to each other as we are all looking out for what is best for the safety of all of our children in school. I just need to update parents regarding the use of the bus stop for drop offs. As from today this will no longer be an option. The council are sending road enforcement officers to various locations as they do not wish any stopping at bus stops. If an officer is present and do you stop this will incur a fine. This is a change to previous advice, however the advice has now changed from the local authority. Please also do not pull into the school gates.
