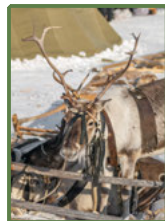
It's summer and the icebergs are melting in the sea. You need to go fishing to catch a Narwhal whale. Act out what you do, see, hear, smell and feel.

It's summer and the ice and snow is melting on the ground. You need to herd reindeer across the water and ice to higher ground. Act out what you do, see, hear, smell and feel.



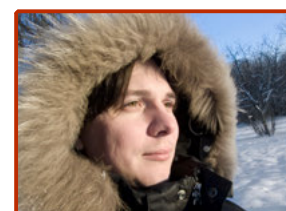
