

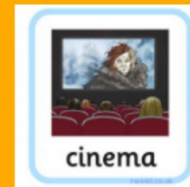
Hard 'c' sound

Sounds like a 's'

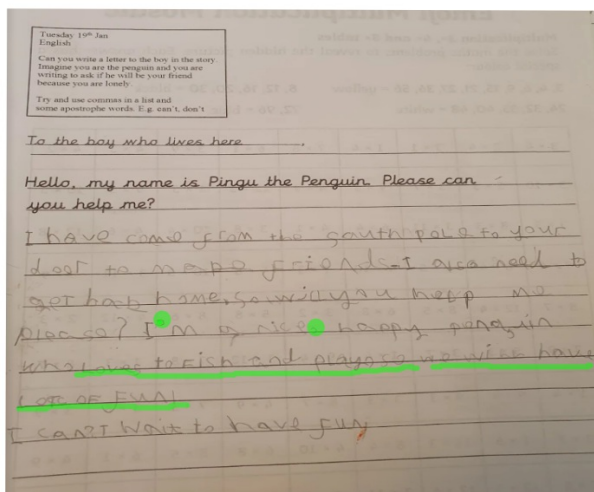


One day, the circus came to the city. Chloe went straight after school to go to the show. She was very excited about seeing Crusty the clown.
