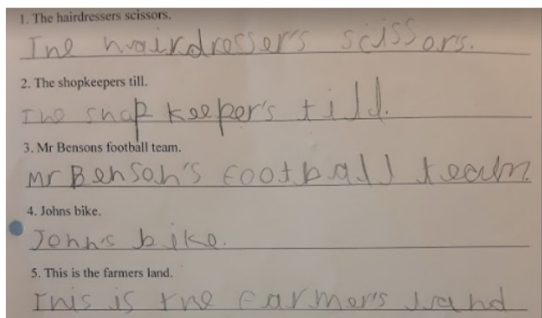


Yesterday, we were learning how to use possessive apostrophes

10. The tail of the lion.

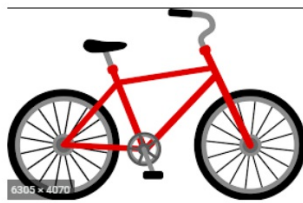
The lion's tail.

You put the apostrophe in the name of the person or animal

Sometimes we got the position of the apostrophe slightly wrong
