#### **REMOTE LEARNING**

I would also like to say another huge thank you to the staff for all their efforts in changing the way they have taught over the past 7 weeks. As we have seen most if not all of the work during this time there is no

need to send it into school unless, we haven't seen it. Of course, if there is a need for further remote learning, all the systems are ready to be re-established very quickly.

As a reward for being so great we have decided that we will hold a virtual end of remote learning party for all classes this Friday. The class teachers will be sending out the details to you over this week in readiness for fun and games on Friday.



#### **RETURN TO SCHOOL**



Hopefully, you will have all received the letter from last week outlining the return to school for all the children as from next Monday. We are so looking forward to seeing all of the children back in school and in class where they belong. Of course, we still have to remain vigilant and make sure we maintain social distance, have extremely good hand hygiene, stay within our bubbles both in school and at the start and end of the day as well as staying healthy. We will see what the next month brings

before we then have the Easter break. Hopefully, we will not have to close any of the class bubbles but again there is no guarantee. Please do your part as parents and socially distance yourselves when bringing and collecting the children from school at the beginning and end of the day. It is important that we, as adults, set that example. We would ask that only one adult from the family brings or collect the child/ren from school to minimise the number of adults on site at any one time. The case rates within South Gloucestershire still remain above the national average and are higher than when we returned in September. Therefore, we do still need to be vigilant in our interactions with each other. That way we will be able to stay safe.

Our risk assessment has been updated for the children's return to school. This has been sent with the newsletter for your information.

# **CURRICULUM**

Thankfully, due to the very high engagement of the children over the past couple of months of remote learning, we have managed to maintain the vast majority of our curriculum offer. When the children do return next week we will be concentrating on returning them to the routines and expectations of school life and learning. This will also involve ensuring that they secure those social and emotional benefits of being with their friends. Therefore, we will be working on re-establishing those connections through games, social time, speaking and listening activities



and collaboration when in class and at playtimes as well. This will be a major focus for the first week alongside re-assessing where the children are academically.

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We will be using some 'cold task' to check how well the children have retained the knowledge from the Autumn term as well as the learning that has taken place remotely.

This will provide us with a benchmark as to the 'pitch' of the learning during the rest of this term and beyond. The teachers can then plan accurately what the children need. We have been continuing with 'catch up' groups for some of the children remotely. These will continue to the end of the term in school and then reassessed. If we feel your child requires additional 'catch-up' support for any reason we will be contacting you directly by the end of March.

#### **SURGE TESTING**

We are aware that there has been a plea from PHE for the residents in the following postcodes to undertake testing due to the recent discovery of the new Brazilian variant of Covid. If you are living in these postcodes BS32 0, BS32 8, BS32 9, BS34 5, BS34 6. Drive-in surge testing sites will be open at Stoke Gifford Parkway Park & Ride, as well as The Mall Coach Park at The Mall Cribbs Causeway from 9am today until next Monday. These are PCR tests so more accurate than lateral flow tests. For piece of mind please do seek a test.
