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

ARTS WEEK AND EASTER

The children had an excellent end to the Spring Term engaging in the Easter themed Arts Week.

The Reception children thoroughly enjoyed learning about and exploring different media and techniques during our Easter themed Arts Week. The children were taught how to paint using water colours, after carefully looking at the tulips and daffodils, they produced some fantastically detailed paintings of spring flowers. They explored printing using their fingers to make the outline of a cross on their Easter cards and used forks and tubes to create Easter chicks and bunnies. They also completed lots of Easter themed activities during their choosing time including collaging rainbow Easter eggs with coloured paper, decorating polystyrene eggs with sequins, pens and feathers and making Easter chicks from tubes with feathers, tissue paper and googly eyes!





The children in Year 3 and 4 have had a fantastic week, emerging themselves in art and creating some wonderful, varied pieces of work through paint drawing and squiggles. Initially, they learned about the artist Ivan Guaderamma who was born in Mexico in 1984 and used his mixed media, interactive art to inspire their painting of the cross which has been printed and used on their Easter cards. They also looked at the work by Jay One who spreads the word of God through graffiti and created some of their own work.





Year 5 and 6's Art Week began with a portrait challenge - to find a portrait (painting or photograph) and recreate the pose at home. They were certainly very creative!

The artist we chose to investigate was Ivan Guaderamma, a Mexican born artist who presented a new technique called 'Glass Expression'. We were inspired by his use of



background colours, a printed image of Jesus Christ, a depiction of the Last Supper and his stencilled word 'LOVE'. We created our own using Guaderamma's style but instead of 'LOVE', we chose one of our Christian values to write.

We created Easter Cards, participated in 'the Big Sing', created our own illustrations to the song 'Glorious Day'. Some of us even wrote our own Easter songs! Finally, we spent some time outside in the beautiful sunshine and created natural crosses.
