## **COVID UPDATE**

Unfortunately, we had a positive case from an adult who accompanied the children on the Year 6 trip to Barry Island last Friday, therefore all Year 6's are currently self-isolating at home and engaging in remote learning for the next week. The staff on the trip, including myself, are also self-isolating. Luckily this was on a Friday and we didn't have contact with anyone else so the rest of the school has not been affected. Cases locally are rising again, so we do need to be extra vigilant whilst on the school premises. Parents please ensure you are socially distancing whilst bringing your children to and collecting from school – waiting in the car park and playground. I would also like to remind you to keep wearing your masks while you are on the school site. Thank you for your co-operation in our efforts to keep everyone safe and healthy.

The Year 6's did have a great day at Barry Island being able to explore the beach, build amazing creative sandcastle structures and sculptures, enjoy a paddle in the sea, buy some Barry rock and eat chips and a side of their choice along with ice-cream for dessert. It was well worth seeing the children's joy of being able to go on a trip and venture outside the school gates. The children and the adults had a very good time. I think it has been summed up by one parent's comments after the trip and the subsequent news
