BOOK WEEK

Once again our annual Book Week has been a great success. The children thoroughly enjoyed the texts they have been studying linked to Remembrance and created very good pieces of writing and artwork linked to the activities. There was

a huge amount of books that were brought into school for the Book Swap on Thursday. It all goes to help the planet, recycling the books we read to save on paper and printing especially in the week when COP26 took place. Drop and read was also a great success.

Book at Bedtime was very well attended with just under 100 children coming back to school to listen to different stories read by the staff and enjoy their hot chocolate and cookies before going home to bed. The fires were roaring (virtually) as the children listened intently. Thank you to the PA and parental helpers for the making of the drinks.



Reception enjoyed their first ever Book Week at Almondsbury. They especially enjoyed their Year 6 buddies coming down to them for the afternoon to share a story and going to the library for the first time to borrow a book. On Friday they dressed up as their favourite book day characters and all looked fantastic!

KS1 had an exciting book week packed full of activities. In class, we looked at the book 'What we'll build' by Oliver Jeffers. We discussed the importance of building things like cars and houses but also the need to build confidence and friendships. It was great to see so many children come back to school for Books at Bedtime, enjoying stories and delicious hot chocolate! The week ended with the children dressing up as their favourite book characters, they all looked amazing as they strutted down the catwalk in our KS1 fashion show!

Year 3 and 4 have based their activities during Book Week on The Lion and the Unicorn by Shirley Hughes. The book is based on the experiences of a young boy during World War II called Lenny, who became an evacuee and moved to the countryside. The children have enjoyed writing diary entries based on Lenny's events as well as arts and crafts based on the book. The children are looking forward to discovering more about the book during Remembrance Week.



Year 5 and 6 have spent Book Week reading Archie's War. The children created their own scrapbook pages based on WW1 and even had chance to interview a soldier! They had a fantastic time sharing books with the younger children during The Big Read and were very pleased with their new books from our Book Swap. They had some great ideas for costumes on Friday too!

ANTI BULLYING WEEK

Next week is Anti-bullying week and to mark the start of this we will be asking the children to wear **odd socks** to school on Monday 15 November. Over the week in their lessons,

PSHE and class workshops will be focusing on being aware of what bullying is and isn't as well as how to help report if the children feel they are being bullied or see someone else being bullied.

Last week the Key Stage 2 pupils watched a video presentation from the NSPCC about how to keep themselves safe from harm, which also included verbal and physical abuse. We feel this is important as safeguarding is a serious issue and our children need to be aware of how they can report or support each other. Covid has brought many pressures and difficulties for teenagers, and we have seen a high level of demand for help from parents. To help parents struggling with anxious teenagers, we have created a therapy group for parents to come together and share their experiences in a safe and confidential place.

The group will be on Thursdays from 3.15-4.45 and will start in January. The group will meet at The Bridge Foundation in Cotham in Bristol. Two therapists will facilitate the group at the Bridge Foundation – Anita Bradford and Ros De Silva experienced facilitators.
