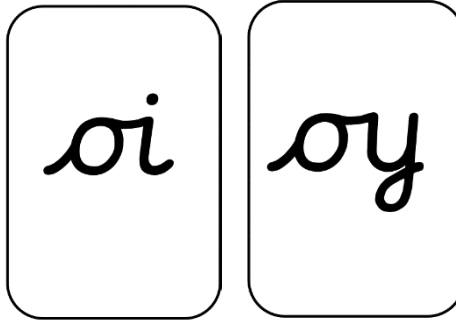


Friday 24<sup>th</sup> April 2020

The Phonics Fairy says

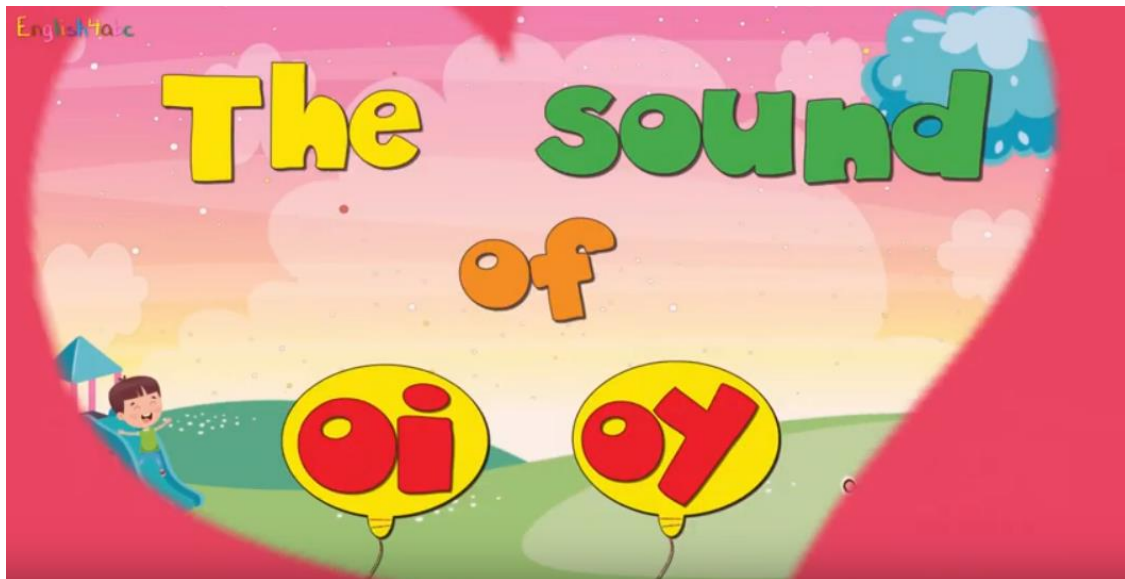
“oi, oi, boil the oil.”

oy	boy	Makaton sign for boy - cut beard off with index finger straight under chin	oy, oy, toy for a boy
