# YEAR 6 VISIT TO PARIS

What a fantastic time the Year 6 children and the adults had in France last week. The weather was beautiful and the children were on their very best behaviour and represented themselves, our school and the UK extremely well. There were lots of comments from the public as they went around Paris and Brie on how well behaved and polite they were. Well done children! As usual the adults behaved themselves as well and provided such great care and support for the children. Thank you to Mrs Goode, for organising the visit, Mr Dean, Mr Allen, Miss Winter, Mrs Bryant, Mr Evans and Mrs Vicary for giving up their time to accompany the children and give them such great memories.



In terms of activities, the week was action packed, leaving school at 4.30am on Monday and returning at 8.30pm on Friday. On Tuesday they visited Brie, a little French market town, and bought some lovely gifts for their families, then completed exciting activities on the chateau grounds as well as an evening trip to a snail farm. Wednesday saw the trip into Paris and a swift climb up the 700 steps of the Tour Eiffel, then over to the Bateaux Parisians for a sail down the Seine before heading to see the artwork on display at the Musee d'Orsay. Thursday brought the Disney day and a longer than usual wait to get onto the rides. Lastly, en route back to Almondsbury a visit to a chocolate factory on Friday. I am sure they have all now recovered after a restful weekend after packing so much into the past week.



### WORLD BEE DAY

Last week, Reception spent the week learning all about bees. Their focus text was 'Bee and Me' by Alison Jay, which they used as part of their 'Drawing Club' sessions. They also read some non-fiction texts which explained the different parts of a bee and their role within the hive. They learnt why bees are so vital to the environment and that without them we wouldn't have things such as baked beans and tomato ketchup! On Friday they celebrated 'World Bee Day' and enjoyed joining in with activities which included making honey sandwiches, navigating the Beebots from the hive to the flowers and back again, painting pictures of bees using water colours and making wild flower seed bombs. Next time a bee flies into the classroom, the children will no longer scream, but instead watch it carefully and remember how important they are!



### YEAR 5 ENTERPRISE PROJECT

Year 5 have had a fantastic week working on a business project in the style of 'The Apprentice'. The children were put into teams and had to choose one product out of bookmarks, fans, bracelets and coasters which they thought they could sell to their target market – the year 3's and 4's. Over the course of the week, they designed and made their products as well as creating their own TV adverts. The week ended with the children dressing up in business suits and dresses and selling their products at their own mini market. It was a huge success, and we are so proud of them.

South Gloucestershire Council have backed a scheme to encourage all children to use and utilise their local libraries. This is to promote the love of reading and encourage children to read as much and often as they can or would like. As a result, all children in Reception, Year 1 and 6 will be issued with a library card unless you wish to opt out of the scheme. From next year all Reception and Year 6 children will be issued a library card and this will continue until all children within primary schools have one. There is a letter sent along with the newsletter to outline the information

and provide an opt out route. We will be welcoming the Children's Library service at the start of July to talk to the children about the Summer Reading Challenge. So watch this space.
