





### Useful information

#### Insurance

- PGL Insurance is included for all tours. The cover is provided by AVIVA.
- Health and safety risk assessments are completed for the site itself, all the activities and the excursions.

#### Pocket Money

• We recommend the children bring €50. We will keep this safe in safety deposit boxes at the centre.

### Clothing

- See kit list: sensible shoes or trainers are advised along with a sweatshirt, complete change of clothes in case of bad weather, sports gear (for activity session) and waterproof coat/hat.
- Letters to go in suitcases / be sent ahead to the centre.

#### Passport

- We will have a Group passport.
- Children need to bring their European Health Card / Global Health Insurance Card
