# **BOOK WEEK**

Once again our annual Book Week has been a great success. The children thoroughly enjoyed the texts they have been studying linked to Diversity and created very good pieces of writing and artwork linked to the activities. Drop and read and the Big Read were great successes. The children had a fantastic time sharing books with the younger children during The Big Read.



The week kicked off with the Reading Breakfast. It was so good to see lots of parents join their children to share and read books in the library area of school as well as enjoying the toast, coffee and squash.



Book at Bedtime was very well attended with just under 130 children coming back to school to listen to different stories read by the staff and enjoy their hot chocolate and cookies before going home to bed. The fires were roaring (virtually) as the children listened intently. Thank you to the PA and parental helpers for the making the drinks. Many parents also attended the Reading workshop and were able to buy books from the Book Fair.



Reception enjoyed their first ever Book Week at Almondsbury. They especially enjoyed their Year 6 buddies coming down to them for the afternoon to share a story and going to the library for the first time to borrow a book. We looked at the book 'Coming to England' by Floella Benjamin and Diane Evans. We thought about what we would pack in our suitcases if we had to move countries and created self-portraits of ourselves to share with each other like a passport.

KS1 had an exciting book week packed full of activities. In class, we looked at the book 'Rice and Rocks' by Sandra L Richards. We thought about the food in the book and that rice and beans are eaten all over the world. We shared our traditional family meals and the countries they come from as well as cooking some things ourselves. The week ended with the children dressing up as their favourite book characters, they all looked amazing as they strutted down the catwalk in our KS1 fashion show!

Year 3 and 4 have based their activities during Book Week on 'Masala's Magic Pencil' by Masala Yousafzai. The book is based on the experiences of Masala and how she wanted to change the world. We were inspired to write what we would do if we could change the world to make it a much better place to be.

Year 5 and 6 have spent Book Week reading a book of poetry called 'Out of Wonder'. This is written by the same author Kwame Alexander that we looked at during Diversity Week before half term. It inspired the children to write their own poetry about the wonders of the world and who provided awe and wonder for them.

The children also were challenged to create a Potato Character – their favourite book character made from decorating or making a costume for the potato. There were some cracking entries, which were all fab! Here are just a few of them.



The children looked fantastic in their costumes on Friday which made it extremely difficult to choose the various class winners who received prizes. It was good to see lots of homemade costumes being worn.
