NUMBER DAY

On Friday 3 February, all the children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 took part in the NSPCC Number Day. The children came to school dressed in numbers or in Maths related costumes, like dominoes, Number Blocks and dice. They enjoyed spending the day completing Maths activities, including playing Maths games, sing Maths songs, listening to Maths related stories and playing the online game Numbots. We raised £65.00 for the NSPCC charity.

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SCIENCE AT ALMONDSBURY



Science is one of the core subjects and is treated as such with the subject being taught on a weekly basis. The children are exposed to all three areas of science each year including Biology, Chemistry and Physics. The childrens' knowledge is built up over time with some of the areas revisited over the seven years including the study of plants.



Here the children start with identifying parts of the plant and conditions for growth moving



through to the process of photosynthesis and links to the water cycle. Children gain a vast amount of knowledge over their time learning about these aspects. Integrated into the science learning is working scientifically where the children learn how to conduct a fair test including predictions, methodology of organising and running an investigation, observing, collating and analysing results in a variety of ways. The children have assistance in the form of the flowchart of the processes that they undergo during the investigations. Depending on the focus of the learning they may not do all aspects until they are confident in employing their



knowledge in all aspects. Of course as with all of our subjects we identify the specific vocabulary needed for the children to explain their thinking. These are listed on the knowledge organisers you receive each term. The children also record their learning both of knowledge acquisition and application of processes in their books in 'double page 'spreads in key stage 2 or on supported recording sheets in KS1. Do ask the children about their scientific learning and knowledge.

PARENTS EVENING

We have Parents Evenings coming up after half term. These will be face to face. It will provide parents with an opportunity to look at the children's books. However, we realise that parents may also prefer to have a virtual meeting. If this is the case, please let your class teacher know so they can set up an online meeting for a specific time. Please look out for an email for you to book your time slot to meet your child's teacher(s).

SEND OPPORTUNITY

Over the coming months we will be hosting parents workshops and projects for those parents who feel they would like more information or advice on certain aspects of supporting their children. These will all be run through and by Jigsaw Thornbury.

The first of these is on Tuesday 28 February from 10.00 - 11.00am. This will be a workshop of Speech Language and Communication needs. Here is the detailed information for you.

'Do you observe difficulties in attention, listening and following instructions; a difficulty in making sense of language heard around them?

Does your young person find it difficult to follow or engage in social conversation? Do you have a young person who finds it difficult to express their ideas, wants or feelings?

Speech, language and communication are central life skills. It is linked to learning, attainment, behaviour, social and emotional development as well as mental wellbeing. This Awareness session will help you to identify your child, young person's speech, language, and communication difficulties and will introduce you to the foundations and tools for supporting them.

These Connect sessions, identified by parents, set to improve the awareness, engagement and connections for parent's supporting their young person's physical, educational, or emotional wellbeing. Our Connect series has been funded by South Gloucestershire Council and are FREE to attend. The session will be delivered by our team within schools at school times.

Connect aims to:

Increase the awareness and confidence of parents/carers on 6 topic areas: Sensory Awareness, School Anxiety and Avoidance (EBSA), Behaviour Regulation, Speech Language Communication, Recognising Emotions and Sleep. Increase parent/carer connection and engagement; to know how to support their child, or seek additional guidance with confidence.

Each session will be accompanied with a 'fridge sheet', a reminder tool of the session, and what parent's need in their toolkit when supporting their child. There will also be an opportunity to view some useful

resources from our Sensory Lending Resource Library and Toolkits to purchase from our linked Toolkit sessions.

Any presentation slides will be sent by email following the session. No mobile phones will be permitted during the session or whilst on school grounds and should remain turned off and in bags. In case of emergency the school office can be contacted to connect you.'
